Two Offenders Leave Plummer Community Corrections Center

Two offenders serving sentences at the Plummer Community Corrections Center (PCCC) in Wilmington left the facility grounds without authorization Thursday, April 25. Matthew Funk and Wayne Williams were seen jumping over the facility's perimeter wall around 7:30 p.m. A headcount confirmed the two men were not on grounds.

Funk is a 29-year-old white male who is 5'08" and weighs 170 pounds. He has blue eyes and blonde hair and a scar on his right cheek. He was serving a six-month sentence for a Violation of Probation on an original charge of Aggravated Act of Intimidation. He arrived at PCCC on April 17. His last known address is in Newark, DE.

Williams is a 41-year-old white male who is 5'05" and weighs 160 pounds. He has hazel eyes and brown hair, with tattoos on his left calf, left hand, left arm, right arm and right forearm. He was serving a one-year sentence for Burglary 2nd. He arrived at PCCC on April 17. His last known address is in Vineland, NJ.

Officers continue their search and request that anyone with information call (800) 542-9524 or their local police department.

Plummer Community Corrections Center is a Level 4 facility where the Department of Correction manages offenders who are transitioning back into the community. These centers are not secured like Level 5 prisons, as offenders are permitted to leave the facility to go to work, seek jobs or attend approved treatment sessions.
